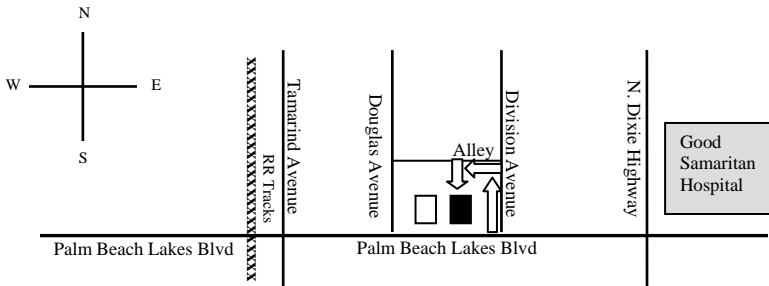

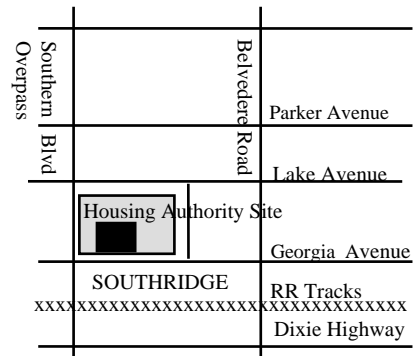

Vickers Houseour history, from the Director

Youth and Family Services Division, was created in 1997, over ten years ago-- at that time, as a Division of one person, I was told to go forth, see what the needs are in the community, pull together resources to address those needs or create new resources to find solutions. Thus the Path was set.

After conducting an extensive study over 6 months, the issues I would strive to address presented themselves: Homelessness, Critical unmet daily living needs for elderly including housing repair, food, healthcare; the increasing needs of the immigrants moving to the area; low income families struggling for self-sufficiency including lack of jobs, and education, Healthcare for those without documentation including addressing the lack of assistance for people with special needs such as mental illness; yes, these were just a few of the needs that were to become the focus for the Youth and Families Division.

To address these needs, in 1999 I was offered the opportunity to rehab a dilapidated structure which I envisioned would be a place where I could help people who needed it most. By June of 2000, the Vickers House at 811 Palm Beach Lakes was restored --with the help of volunteers (mainly teens) and donations, this center was to become the First Community Resource Center—a center where people can walk-in—no appointment needed--for whatever kind of help they need—Free of charge. Over the years we have developed community partnerships with other agencies, non-profits, faith-based groups, health care providers, and volunteer groups, both young and old to respond to our residents who need help.

If there were gaps in services—the Vickers House created services and programs to address those gaps, such as our Homeward Bound program, which was started in 2002-- By 2009 we had sent over 650 people back home to family with all donations from the community, over \$70,000 --all for bus tickets! Because the low income residents living in our Vickers House Neighborhood needed help, we created Job Fairs, assistance with Resume development, help with obtaining Public Benefits and Healthcare, and more, plus we became one of the First VITA sites in the County offering Free Help with Tax Preparation, leading the County each year in numbers of clients assisted.

When the Second Vickers House at 3801 Georgia Ave was opened in 2004, due to the generosity of the West Palm Beach Housing Authority (allowing us to use their building), we began addressing the needs of the Hispanic community, thus we began a partnership with the Palm Beach County School District and created classes in Citizenship, Family Literacy, ESOL and Computers.

But it is our Vickers House Assistance Programs for those who are in Crisis where we really excelled! Besides helping the Homeless find their way back home, we also provide assistance to law enforcement, code enforcement, schools, businesses, faith-based groups and neighborhoods all with calls concerning homeless, elderly in distress, families in crisis---often pulling together donations from Vickers House Friends in order to offer some resolution to the problem—being creative tailoring the solution to the case at hand. Unlike many organizations in the community, the Vickers House has no eligibility requirements, we help everyone, with anything, “we just get it done”—help those who need it, anyway we can!

In 2006, because of the demand for more assistance with the elderly we began the “Elders on the Edge” program, in partnership with Legal Aid—collecting donations which have been used mainly to relocate elderly losing their homes! By 2009, we had helped over 80 elderly homeowners with code violations --making repairs and painting with the help of volunteer youth groups, such as M-Fuge. Since 1997 this division in partnership with youth groups and faith-based groups has repaired and painted over 300 homes in the City.

Yes---the work we do could not be done without the support of the community and our volunteers --our youngest volunteers has been 10 years old and our oldest 96! And your donations have included equipment, and furniture for use at both Vickers House locations—yard tools, paint, clothes, disaster supplies, food, toys, diapers, etc . . . all these donations have been directly donated back to the community we serve! With our small staff of 4 full-time employees, we could not do so much, for so many, without the help of our community and for that we thank you again!

From all those we have helped over the last 10+ years --we Thank you! And we hope you will continue supporting us in the future! Please know how much we thank all our friends in the community who not only help the Vickers House, but who also do their own good deeds in the community, which most often, go totally unnoticed--- but those who are homeless, hapless and helpless know who you are---and so do I!

Homeward Bound Program

This program offers homeless the opportunity to reunite with their families back home. Verification of acceptance by a relative is mandatory. If homeless are eligible then a non-refundable / non-transferable bus ticket is purchased through donations, each ticket costs approximately \$150.00 **If you would like to donate to this program , make checks payable to our fiscal agent:**

Some of the journeys for the homeless are across the country therefore take several days on the bus! At the Vickers House we strive to give them some food they can eat on the bus during their trip home. We need your donations of snacks such as: Cheese n crackers, peanut butter and crackers, cookies, dried fruit, nuts, beef or turkey jerky, candy bars, chips and juice drink boxes.

" Free" Employment Readiness Workshop: "How to get a Job"

Session One -- Offers a wide range of services to include resume & cover letter development (Students will use Vickers House Computers to develop their own resume, and cover letter.)

Session Two-- Students will learn how to search the job market, applying for a job & making sure you have all the documents needed, and internet access/applying for a job on-line. Students will be practicing filling out job applications and will be asked to spend time searching for jobs on line on our Vickers House computers.

Session Three --How to handle phone interviews, how to handle one-on-one & group interviews, and follow up with a potential employer. This session includes how to greet the employer, appearance & other body language techniques for the interview, sample questions for the interview, and how to deal with the tough questions.

Session Four -- Will include Practicing an Interview for a simulated job, using their resume & application. This Mock Interview which will be video taped and played back for the student- to review dos and don'ts and how to make the necessary changes to get them the job.

Upon completion of this course Vickers House will continue to work with these students to assist in their job search, being there for support and guidance when needed. Students need to bring Pen & notebook to take notes, for first session bring old resumes if possible, information of previous work history, documentation needed for work(what you don't have will be assessed), for Graduation Interview, Students will be asked to come Dressed for the Interview for the Videotaping.

Students need to attend all Four Sessions – to receive full benefits of on-going job search assistance from Vickers House Staff! This workshop will be offered at both Vickers House Locations—call for a schedule and find out how you can register!

REGISTER NOW FOR HURRICANE SHELTERS FOR YOU AND YOUR PET

Residents living in a Hurricane Evacuation Zone, Mobile Home or Manufactured Home should evacuate during severe tropical storms and ALL Hurricanes. If you require transportation to a Hurricane Evacuation Shelter call (561) 649-9838 or 1(877) 870-9849 toll-free to request an application.

To find out if you reside in a Hurricane Evacuation Zone, you may contact the Palm Beach County Division of Emergency Management at (561) 712-6400.

Special Needs Shelters for the Elderly and others with Special Medical Needs or Dementia

If you require special care or have special needs, you are urged to pre-register for the Special Care Unit (SCU or Special Needs Unit SNU) with the Palm Beach County Division of Emergency Management at (561) 712-6400

People/Pet Shelters

To pre-register for the Pet Friendly Shelter (disaster shelter for pets and people) call PBC Animal Care and Control (561) 233-1266 for more information. The Pet Friendly Shelter is for pets and people living in mandatory evacuation zones or in mobile homes.

Some of the requirements:

Pet owners are required to bring a kennel, cage or carrier, food for two to three days, bedding, bowls, toys, and any special medications for their pets – Birds must have a health certificate and a carrier cage with cover – No livestock or reptiles will be accepted – All dogs and cats must have a current rabies vaccination and license, tag, or microchip, and provide date of last application of flea and tick preventative medication – You can apply on-line at www.pbcgov.com/publicsafety/animal/PetShelter.htm

For people who do not have access to computers we have all 3 applications: Hurricane Evacuation Transportation Reservations, Special Needs/Special Care Unit Shelter Reservations, and Pet Friendly Shelter Reservations. These can be found at both Vickers House Locations (3801 Georgia Avenue & 811 Palm Beach Lakes Blvd.) At the Vickers House we also have flyers we have developed on related hurricane topics such as: Preparations for Elderly, preparing



your pet for the storm, lists of all the hotels/motels in Palm beach County which will take animals, kennels and veterinarians who will house pets during the storm, applications for pet reservations at Peggy Adams Animal Rescue Shelter, food safety for power outages, important brochures on FEMA, and other related topics. “Elders on the Edge”

Elders on the Edge is a program designed to give people in the community an opportunity to sponsor a Senior in need of assistance (such as assistance with utility payments, rental payments, relocation payments for those who are losing their homes, sponsorship for adult day care, assistance with household repairs, building of wheelchair ramps, homemaker assistance, assistance with the purchase of medical devices or medications, and assistance with legal costs and other unmet needs. If you would like to donate to this program, Any amount is appreciated.

All donated funds are used for the direct purchase of the needed service for the senior in crisis!

These donations will be accepted and disbursed by the Legal Aid Society(our Partner and Fiscal Agent). The maximum allowance per family is \$1,000 per annum. Funds will be paid directly to the Service Provider. Senior recipients will be screened by Vickers House, then once accepted placed on a waiting list until funds are donated.

Seniors must be age 60 years or over, indigent or low income (must be able to provide proof of income), without family support or other financial resources (Social Security, SSI, or Pension—only available income) referred to or client of Vickers House or Legal Aid Society. The senior must be willing to receive services provided for by this program and follow guidelines for our services. Legal Aid Society and Vickers House will partner to insure our seniors receive all possible care and compassion through their crisis situation.

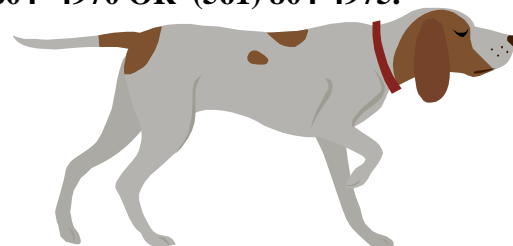
“Elders on the Edge Pet Fund”-
